of secs. 25 and 36.

S.89*56'W., on a true line, bet. secs. 25 and 36.

Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense
undergrowth.

Ascend E. slope.

5.60 Top of ridge, bears N. and S.; descend W. slope.

23.40 Creek, 5 lks. wide, course NW.; ascend.

29.50 Ravine, course NE.; continue ascent.

39.38 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in the
ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked

Land, mountainous.

Undergrowth, rhododendron, chinquapin, tan oak and buckhorn.
