- 7.60 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course E.
- 10.00 Creek, 5 lks. wide, course NE.; ascend.
- 24.50 Ascend steep rocky slope.
- 30.51 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked

- 67.10 Top of spur, slopes E.; descend.
- 70.51 The cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11.

Timber, fir, laurel and chinquapin.

Undergrowth, tan oak, rhododendron, hazel and young fir.
