## General Description.

This entire township has but one general character which is mountainous, rough and broken, gravelly soil.

Inclined to be rocky of 3rd and 4th rates: covered with a heavy growth of medium timber and dense underbrush. It contains no agricultural land whatever and is only valuable for its timber, which is greatly inaccessible and its mineral wealth.

Gold can be secured in nearly any locality and Grave Creek has been mined extensively and quite successfully.

The mining is principally carried on through the winter months when water is plentiful. Therefore I saw no mining in operation beyond two miners at work on Grave Creek. Several Quartz ledges have been located but none developed of any particular value.

Water was not plentiful and all streams were at their minimum flow while many dry ravines would have spring branches through the wet seasons.

The water was pure and soft- free from all alkalies. Grave Creek drains the greater part of the township.
