1.50	Summit of divide bears N and S and descend on W slope of mountain.
28.53	Old trail bears N and S.
28.88	A Fir, 30 ins. diam. line tree marked with 2 notches on E and W sides.
35.78	Old trail bears N and S.
37.85	Foot of descent -800 ft. and branch 3 lks. wide, course NW. Across old mining diggings mined about 30 years ago and now all grown up with brush to
38.60	spring branch 2 lks. wide, course NW, the same branch divided by mining. Ascend on NE slope of mt. spur.
40.34	Set granite stone 16 x 8 x 5 ins. 11 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N side from which A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.27*30'E., 53 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.41*W., 44 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
44.28	Top of mt. spur, +150 bears N. Descend on steep NW slope.
49.18	Foot of descent -200 and branch 2 lks. wide, course N30*E. Ascend on steep NE slope.
58.88	Top of mt. ridge +400 bears N.20*E and S.20*W. Descend on steep NW slope.
62.00	A Fir, 18 ins. diam. line tree, marked with 2 notches on E and W sides.
68.40	Foot of descent -400 and branch 2 lks. wide, course N. Ascend E slope.
69.70	Ravine 25 ft. deep and spring branch 1 lk. wide course NE.
80.68	The cor. to secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11. +200 Land, mountainous, broken, rough. Heavy timber of Fir, Cedar, Pine and Matherone. Dense underbrush of small Fir, Laurel, Matherone, Live Oak and Hazel. Soil 3rd rate, slate gravel.
