Timber Pine, Fir, Laurel, Chinquapin and etc., with thick undergrowth the balance of the Township, West of the line is all High Timbered Bushy Mountains, unfit for cultivation and unsurveyed.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

This township lies in the hills and mountains north and south of Wolf Creek and is mostly unfit for settlement.

The Jacksonville road runs through the township from north to south, on which one claim has been taken and which is the only desirable location in the township.

The North boundary runs along the north slope south of Cow Creek, near which another claim is taken, the two mentioned settlements comprising all in the township.

The township is generally heavily timbered with Fir, Pine, Laurel and Live Oak, with a dense undergrowth of same.

The soil is of a 2nd rate quality valuable mostly for grazing. A list of the names of the individuals employed to assist in running, measuring, or marking the lines and corners described in the foregoing field notes of Township No.33 South of the base line of Range No.6 West of the Willamette Meridian showing the respective capacities in which they acted.
