S 10 on SW. and S 3 on NW. faces; also 5 notches on S.
and 2 notches on E. angles of same for corner to secs.

A Fir, 26 ins. diam., bears S.58*E., 28 lks. dist.,

A Sugar Pine, 6 ins. diam., bears S.42*W., 18 lks.
dist., Marked T 33 S R 7 W S 10 B T.

A Cedar, 16 ins. diam., bears N.70*W., 8 lks. dist.,
Marked T 33 S R 7 W S 3 B T.
