

Subdivisions of T. 33 S., R. 7 W.

CHAINS

Set a Fir post, 4 feet long, 4 ins. square, 2 feet in the ground, marked C C T 33 S R 7 W on S., S 2 and 2 notches on E., S 3 and 4 notches on W. and T 32 S R 7 W S 35 on N. faces for the closing corner between secs. 2 and 3, from which

A Laurel, 10 ins. diam., bears S.24*E., 6 lks. dist.

Marked T 33 S R 7 W S 2 B T.

A Chinquapin, 12 ins. diam., bears S.47*W., 12 lks. dist., Marked T 33 S R 7 W S 3 B T.

A Chinquapin, 5 ins. diam., bears N.45*W., 22 lks. dist., Marked T 32 S R 7 W S 35 B T.

Land, hilly and broken.

Soil, gravelly, second and third rate.

Timber, generally good, chiefly, Fir, Pine, Laurel and Oak.

North between secs. 21 and 22.

Va. 17*30'E.

- 8.00 Top of spur, Course SE. Steep descent.
- 29.10 A creek, 15 lks. wide, Course SE. Ascent.
- 40.00 Set a Laurel post, 3 feet long, 3 ins. square, 18 ins. in the ground, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on W. side, for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner, from which
 - A Laurel, 6 ins. diam., bears N.88*E., 22 lks. dist.
 - Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T and
 - A Laurel, 6 ins. diam., bears N.45*W., 30 lks. dist.
 - Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
- 53.50 Top of spur, Course SE. Descend.
- 80.00 Set a Maple post, 4 feet long, 4 ins. square, 2 feet in the ground, marked T 33 S R 7 W S 15 on NE., S 22 on
