16.00	A stream, 1 lk. wide, Course S., 50 feet below top of spur, begin ascent of SE. mountainslope.
39.84	<p>Set a Fir post, 3 feet long, 3 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 4 on N., and 9 on S. face, from which</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A Cedar, 5 ins. diam., bears N.71$\frac{1}{2}$*E., 18 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 4 B T.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A Cedar, 4 ins. diam., bears S.4*E., 29 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 9 B T.</p>
	This corner stands 225 feet above stream.
	Continue ascent of SE. slope.
45.00	The ascent changes to E. slope.
51.40	Top of ridge, bears NW. and SE., 75 feet above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner, begin steep descent of W. slope.
70.00	The descent moderates.
79.68	<p>The corner of secs. 4, 5, 8 and 9 is 250 feet below ridge.</p> <p>Land, mountainous, very rough.</p> <p>Soil, gravelly and rocky, third rate and fourth rate.</p> <p>Timber, Fir, Pine, Cedar, Laurel, Live Oak, Chinquapin.</p> <p>Undergrowth, small Firs and Laurel, Greaswood.</p> <p>Mountainous or heavily timbered land or covered with dense undergrowth. 79.68 chs.</p>
	N.0*1'W. between secs. 4 and 5.
	<p>Descend NW. slope of mountain covered with a dense undergrowth of Live and Burr Oaks, Laurels, Chinquapins, small Firs.</p>
16.40	Enter heavy large Fir, Pine, and Cedar timber, bears E. and W., continue to descend.
21.60	A stream, 2 lks. wide, Course NW., 275 feet below sec. corner, thence along W. slope.
