

Subdivisions of T. 33 S., R. 7 W.

CHAINS

A Yellow Pine, 9 ins. diam., bears S.46 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 142 lks. dist., Marked T 33 S R 7 W S 5 B T.

This corner stands on E. side of ridge, bearing NE. and SW., about 100 feet above stream.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, gravelly and rocky, third rate and fourth rate.

Timber, Fir, Pine, Cedar, Laurel, Chinquapin, Burr Oak, and Live Oak.

Undergrowth, small Fir, Pines, Laurels, Burr Oak, Chinquapin.

Mountainous or heavily timbered land or covered by dense undergrowth. 84.09 chs. and connecting line 10.82 chs.

Set a granite stone, 14 x 12 x 8 ins., 10 ins. in the ground for corner of secs. 7, 8, 17 and 18, marked with 4 notches on S. and 5 notches on E. edges, from which

A Laurel, 8 ins. diam., bears N.71*E., 24 lks. dist., Marked T 33 S R 7 W S 8 B T.

A Laurel, 8 ins. diam., bears S.54*E., 34 lks. dist. Marked T 33 S R 7 W S 17 B T.

A Laurel, 14 ins. diam., bears S.45*W., 109 lks. dist. Marked T 33 S R 7 W S 18 B T.

A Sugar Pine, 50 ins. diam., bears N.66*W., 66 lks. dist., Marked T 33 S R 7 W S 7 B T.

This corner stands 100 feet above Reuben's Creek.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, gravelly, third rate.

Timber, Fir, Yellow and Sugar Pine, Laurel, Chinquapin.

Undergrowth, small Firs, Live Oaks, Poison Laurels, Burr Oaks, Chinquapins.
