

Subdivisions of T. 33 S., R. 7 W.

CHAINS	
50.64	A Sugar Pine, .45 ins. diam., on line, I mark with 2 notches on N. and S. sides.
58.10	A stream, 2 lks. wide, Course SW., 80 feet below ridge, begin ascent of W. slope.
80.00	<p>Set a Fir post, 3 feet long, 4 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground for corner of secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8, marked T 33 S S 5 on NE., R 7 W S 8 on SE., S 7 on SW. and S 6 on NW. faces, with 5 notches on S. and E. edges, and raise a mound of stone, 2 feet base, 1½ feet high, W. of corner. Pits impracticable.</p> <p>This corner stands on SW. slope, 175 feet above stream. Land, mountainous..</p> <p>Soil, gravelly, third rate.</p> <p>Timber, Fir, Cedar, Sugar and Yellow Pine, Laurel, Chinquapin.</p> <p>Undergrowth, small poison Laurel and Chinquapin, Manzanita.</p> <p>Mountainous or heavily timbered land or covered with dense undergrowth. 80.00 chs.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">August 13, 1901.</p>
	Thence I run S.89°46'E. on a random line, between secs. 5 and 8.
40.00	Set temporary ¼ sec. corner.
80.30	<p>Intersect N. and S. line 33 lks. S. of corner of secs. 4, 5, 8 and 9.</p> <p>Descend W. slope of mountain, covered with a dense undergrowth of small Laurels, Chinquapins, Burr and Live Oaks.</p>
7.90	A stream, 2 lks. wide, Course NW., enter heavy large Fir, Cedar and Pine timber, bears N. and S.
80.50	A stream, 6 lks. wide, Course N., 150 feet below sec. corner, begin ascent of E. slope of mountain.
