27.00	The ascent changes to N. slope.
40.15	Set a granite stone, 15 x 12 x 7 ins., 10 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face, from which <p data-bbox="435 653 1419 762">A Fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.43*E., 35 lks. dist., Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S.5 B T. A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S.4*E., 19 lks. dist., Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 8 B T.</p> <p data-bbox="342 908 1451 1009">Continue ascent of mountain slope, corner stands 250 feet above stream.</p>
64.00	Leave large Fir and Pine timber, enter a dense undergrowth of Manzanita, bears N. and S..
66.50	Top of dividing ridge between the waters of Cow Creek and Rogue River, 250 feet above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner, begin steep descent of W. mountainslope, covered with dense undergrowth of Manzanita.
80.30	The corner of secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8, corner stands 150 feet below top of divide.
	Land, mountainous. Soil, gravelly, third rate. Timber, Fir, Cedar, Pine, Chinquapin, Laurel. Undergrowth, Manzanita, small Firs, Laurels, Oaks. Mountainous or heavily timbered land or covered with a dense undergrowth. 80.30 chs.
	S.89*44*W. on a random line between secs. 6 and 7.
40.00	Set temporary $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner.
80.65	Intersect the W. bdy. of Township 48 lks. S. of corner of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 1a.
