40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.81.83 Intersect E. bdy of Tp., 5 lks. S. of the cor. of secs.
12 and 13.

Thence

N.89°47'W., on a true line between secs. 12 and 13.

Asc. 1395 ft. over SE. slope, through heavy green timber
and dense undergrowth, to $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

22.50 Trail, bears NW. and SE.; cabin bears N., 4.00 chs. dist.

40.00 Road, bears NE. and SW.

41.83 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in
