Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, pine, oak and madrona.
Undergrowth, vine maple, rhododendron, hazel, arrow-wood, manzanita and oak.

40.00 S.89*50'E., on a random line, between secs. 24 and 25.
Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
79.78 Intersect E. bdy. of the Tp., 5 lks. S. of the cor.
of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30, hereinbefore described.
Thence
N.89*52'W., on a true line, bet. secs. 24 and 25.
Along steep N. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
4.25 Desc. 220 ft. over NW. slope.
12.00 Dry ravine, course NW.; continue desc. along N. slope.
20.70 Spur, slopes N.; desc. W. slope.
39.89 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked

A pine, 8 ins. diam., bears N.11*E., 4 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 24 B T.
A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.72*E., 23 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 25 B T.
Singe Creek, bears S., $1\frac{1}{2}$ chs. dist.

Thence across flat.

47.70 Steamboat Creek, 110 lks. wide, course S.; asc. 90 ft. over rocky E. slope.
51.60 Spur, slopes S.; desc. 25 ft. over SW. slope.
54.00 Thence over bottom land.
58.90 Right bank of Steamboat Creek, bears NW. and SE.; thence in creek, 4 chs. wide.
