62.90 Right bank of main channel of Steamboat Creek, bears NE. and SW.; thence across small island.

66.90 W. channel of Steamboat Creek, 60 lks. wide, course S. from N.60°E.; asc. 270 ft. over E. slope.

69.35 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course SE. Steamboat trail and Forest Service telephone line, bears NE. and SE.

79.78 The cor. of secs. 23, 24, 25 and 26.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, coarse rocky loam; 2nd and 3rd rate.

Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, pine cottonwood and alder.

Undergrowth, vine maple, rhododendron, willow, hazel, arrow-wood and manzanita.

N.0°01'W., bet. secs. 23 and 24.

Asc. 400 ft. to $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., over rolling E. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

7.40 Dry ravine, course E.

9.50 Spur, slopes E.

12.60 Dry ravine, course E.

13.90 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course SE.

20.25 Spur, slopes SE.

22.30 Dry ravine, course SE.; continue asc. over SE. slope.

27.00 Spur, slopes SE.; continue asc. along E. slope.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked
