8.00 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course SE.; asc. 375 ft. over NE. slope.

22.60 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 25 ft. along N. slope.

31.10 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course NE.; asc. 320 ft. over N.E. slope.

40.06 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., with brass cap marked

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.23\*E., 6 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 13 B T.

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S.38\*W., 11 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 24 B T.

42.75 Desc. 50 ft. over NW. slope.

45.20 Dry ravine, course NE.; asc. 165 ft. over E. slope.

54.00 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 20 ft. over NW. slope.

59.90 Dry ravine, course N.; asc. 270 ft. over NE. slope.

74.00 Continue asc. over SE. slope.

80.12 The cor. of secs. 13, 14, 23 and 24.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, coarse rocky loam; 2nd and 3rd rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock, pine, cedar and madrona.

Undergrowth, vine maple, rhododendron, hazel, arrow-wood and manzanita.

N.0\*01'W., bet. secs. 13 and 14.

Asc. 40 ft. over SE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

6.60 Top of spur ridge, bears NE. and SW. Johnson way trail bears same.
