

Subdivision of T. 25 S., R. 1 E.

Thence

N.89*45'W., on a true line, bet. secs. 14 and 23.

Asc. 20 ft. over SE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

2.60 Top of spur ridge, bears N. and S. Johnson way trail bears same.

Desc. 1140 ft. over W. slope through old burn with dead and scattered timber and very dense undergrowth.

7.75 Dry ravine, course SW.; continue desc. over SW. slope.

25.55 Brook, 1 lk. wide, course N.80*W.; continue desc. over NW. slope.

39.02 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for witness cor. to the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked

A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears N.54*E., 25 lks. dist., marked W C $\frac{1}{4}$ S 14 B T.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.44*W., 43 lks. dist., marked W C $\frac{1}{4}$ S 23 B T.

Descend steep bank into creek.

39.83 The point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. falls on the steep E. bank of Steelhead creek, where it is impossible to establish a permanent corner.

40.30 Steelhead creek, 30 lks. wide, course S.; thence across flat.

44.75 Creek, 10 lks. wide, course SE.; asc. 470 ft. over E. slope.

79.66 The cor. of secs. 14, 15, 22 and 23.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, coarse rocky loam; 2nd and 3rd rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar and pine.

Undergrowth, vine maple, rhododendron, hazel and willow.
