80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11, with brass cap marked

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears N.57 $\frac{1}{2}$ *E., 18 lks. dist., marked T 25 S R 1 E S 2 B T.

A pine, 24 ins. diam., bears S.41 $\frac{1}{2}$ *E., 60 lks. dist., marked T 25 S R 1 E S 11 B T.

A cedar, 18 ins. diam., bears S.54*W., 87 lks. dist., marked T 25 S R 1 E S 10 B T.

A cedar, 20 ins. diam., bears N.74 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 63 lks. dist., marked T 25 S R 1 E S 3 B T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky; 3rd and 4th rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar and pine.

Undergrowth, vine maple, dogwood, hazel, rhododendron and willow.

N.89*59'E., on a random line, bet. secs. 2 and 11.

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

79.82 Intersect N. and S. line, 33 lks. S. of the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12.

Thence

S.89*45'W., on a true line, bet. secs. 2 and 11.

Asc. 400 ft. over steep E. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

11.40 Spur ridge, bears NE. and SW.; desc. 215 ft. over W. slope.

13.20 Johnson trail, bears NE. and SW.

16.70 Three Springs Camp bears North, 5 chs. dist.
