79.62	The cor. of secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30. Land, mountainous. Soil, coarse rocky loam; 2nd and 3rd rate. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar and pine. Undergrowth, vine maple, rhododendron, hazel and laurel.
	West, on a true line, bet. secs. 19 and 30. Asc. NE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
