CHAINS

Soil, coarse rocky loam; 2nd and 3rd rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, and pine.

Undergrowth, vine maple, rhododendron, hazel, laurel,  
willow and manzanita.

Asc. 70 ft. over SW. slope, through heavy timber and
