GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The surface of this township is mountainous, ranging in elevation from 1200 ft. to nearly 5000 ft. above sea level. The entire township is drained through Steamboat Creek into the North Umpqua River.

The soil is generally a coarse rocky sand and clay loam and humus, from a few inches to several feet in depth, usually on basaltic bed rock which outcrops in many places. There are also some sandstone ledges and outcroppings.
