GENERAL DESCRIPTION (continued)

The land is well timbered with fir, hemlock, cedar, pine, and some yew, chinquapin and laurel. Some spruce was noted on the line bet. secs. 5 and 6. The surface is covered with a dense growth of vine maple, rhododendron, hazel, chinquapin, huckleberry, arrow-wood, manzanita, alder, willow, salal and Oregon grape.

The land is of volcanic origin and there is no evidence of any mineral deposits although there is an abandoned patented placer claim in sec. 25.

The land is well watered by many living streams.

There are no settlers in the township and it is valuable principally for timber.

The magnetic declination of the needle varies from 18*30' to 21*30', with a mean mag. decl. of 20*00'E.
