Resurvey of the S. bdy. of T. 25 S., R. 1 E.

CHAINS

From which the original bearing trees,

A sugar pine, 60 ins. in diam., bears N.25*E., 28 lks.
dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{2}$ S 35 B T

A fir, 24 ins. in diam., bears N.55*W., 34 lks.
dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{2}$ S 35 B T

Continue ascent over NE. slope.

45.25 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course NE.; ascend E. slope.

51.75 Spur, 125 ft. above $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor., slopes NE.: descend 50 ft. along N. slope.

59.25 Creek, 4 lks. wide, course N E.; asc. 300 ft. over E. slope.

61.26 Point for the closing cor. of secs. 35 and 36, later determined and hereinafter described.

79.90 Intersect the cor. of secs. 34 and 35 only, which is an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in diam., protruding 9 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 15 ins. in diam., bears N.52*W., 40 lks.
dist., mkd. T 25 S R 1 E S 34 B T

Land, mountainous.

Soil, coarse rocky loam; 2nd and 3rd. rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock and cedar.

Undergrowth, vinemaple, rhododendron, hazel and huckleberry.

West, on a true line on the S. bdy. of sec. 34

Asc. 190 ft. over SE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
