

Subdivisions of T. 25 S., R. 2 E.

CHAINS

Asc. 178 ft. over SE. slope, through old burn, scattering timber and very dense undergrowth.

8.50 Spur, slopes S., desc. 102 ft. over SW. slope.

14.30 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course SE., asc. 572 ft. over NE., changing to gradual E. slope.

25.00 Small stream, course N.

30.00 Leave old burn, bears NW. and SE., thence through heavy timber and medium undergrowth.

40.07 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 24 and 25, with brass cap marked

$$\frac{1}{4} \frac{S24}{S25}$$

A fir, 44 ins. diam., bears S.50*E., 40 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 25 B T

A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears N.8*W., 39 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S24 B T

Asc. 216 ft. over gradual E. slope.

56.90 Grassy Ranch Trail, and telephone line, bears NE. and SW.

65.00 Ridge, bears NE. and SW., desc. 280 ft. over NW., changing to N. slope.

80.14 Cor. of secs. 23, 24, 25, and 26

Land; mountainous.

Soil; mountain loam, and rocky, 2nd and 4th rates

Timber; fir, hemlock, cedar, pine, and madrona.

Undergrowth; mountain laurel, hazel, rhododendron, vinemaple, and manzanita.

N.0*01'W., bet. secs. 23 and 24

Desc. 859 ft. over N., changing to NW. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
