CHAINS

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.2*W., 64 lks.
dist., marked T 25 S R 2 E S 14 B T

Land; mountainous.

Soil; rocky, 4th rate.

Timber; fir, hemlock, cedar, and yew.

Undergrowth; vinemaple, rhododendron, and wild goose
berry.

40.00 N.89*55'E., on a random line, bet. secs. 13 and 24
Set temp. 1/4 sec. cor.

79.90 Intersect E. bdy. of Tp., 19 lks. N. of the cor. of
secs. 13, 18, 19, and 24, hereinbefore described.

Thence

N.89*57'W., on true line bet. secs. 13 and 24

Along broken N. slope, through heavy timber and dense
undergrowth:

7.90 Spring, swamp, course N.

10.50 Leave timber, bears N. and S., enter meadow.

15.50 Spur, slopes N.

18.40 Enter timber, bears N. and S.

24.60 Spring, course N.

28.90 Spring, swamp, course N.

33.00 Reynolds Ridge Way Trail, bears N. and S.

35.60 Reynolds Ridge, bears NW. and SE., desc. 45 ft. over
SW. slope.

39.95 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in diam., 26 ins in
the ground, for the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 13 and 24,
with brass cap marked

$$\frac{1}{4} \frac{S13}{S24}$$
