48.50 Draw, course SW.

Land; mountainous.

Soil; mountain loam, 2nd rate, and rocky, 4th rate.

Timber; fir, cedar, and hemlock.

Undergrowth; rhododendron, vinemaple, and wild goose
berry; good grazing.

N.0°01'W., bet. secs. 13 and 14.

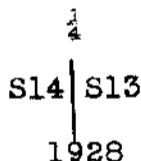
Asc. 200 ft. over SW. slope, through heavy timber and

10.00 Asc. 636 ft. over S. slope, over bluffs.

25.40 Reynolds ridge, bears NW. and SE.

ft. over N. slope.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in
the ground, for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 13 and 14,
with brass cap marked
