13.20 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N., asc. 377 ft. over NE. slope.

18.10 Enter heavy timber and medium undergrowth, bears NW. and SE.

30.40 Spur, bears NW., desc. 148 ft. over SW. slope, along bluffs.

34.27 Top of bluff, 40 ft. high, facing SW., set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 10 ins. in the ground, to bed rock, and in mound of stone, 4 ft. base, for witness cor. to the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 23 and 26, with brass cap marked

A fir, 9 ins. diam., bears North, 42 lks. dist., marked W C $\frac{1}{4}$ S 23 B T

Desc. 222 ft. over SW. slope, over bluffs.

39.86 True point for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. falls on steep insecure ground, impracticable to set cor.

Desc. 798 ft. over SW. slope.

60.70 Desc. 250 ft. over W. slope.

74.00 Desc. 101 ft. over NW. slope.

79.72 Cor. of secs. 22, 23, 26, and 27.

Land; mountainous.

Soil; rocky, 4th rate.

Timber; fir, hemlock, yew, and cedar.

Undergrowth; vinemapple, rhododendron, hazel, wild cherry, and arrow-wood.
