broken NE. slope.

48.90 Spring, course NE.,

51.80 Spur, slopes NE., desc. 324 ft. over broken NW. slope to cor.

72.50 Draw, course NE.,

75.50 Spur, slopes N.,

79.96 Cor. of secs. 17, 18, 19, and 20

Land; mountainous.

Soil; rocky mountain loam, 4th rate.

Timber; fir, hemlock, yew, cedar, and maple.

Undergrowth; rhododendron, vinemaple, salal, huckle berry and chinquapin.

40.00 S.89°40'W., on a random line bet. secs. 18 and 19

Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

59.50 Intersect W. bdy. of Tp. 5 lks. S. of cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19, and 24, described in the field notes of T. 25 S., R. 1 E.

Thence

N.89°43'E., on true line bet. secs. 18 and 19

Asc. 100 ft. along broken SW. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

15.40 Spur, slopes SE., desc. 95 ft. over E. slope.

19.50 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 24 ins. the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 18 and 19, with brass cap marked
