Timber; fir, hemlock, cedar, yew, and pine.  
Undergrowth; rhododendron, vinemaple, salal and huckleberry.

S.89°43'W., on a random line bet. secs. 7 and 18

40.00 Set temp.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.

59.30 Intersect W. bdy. of Tp. 22 lks. S. of cor. of secs. 7, 12, 13, and 18, described in the field notes of T. 25 S., R. 1 E.

Thence

N.89°56'E., on true line bet. secs. 7 and 18.

Desc. 197 ft. over NE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

4.40 Draw, course SE., asc. 100 ft. over broken SW. slope.

9.90 Spur, slopes S.,

12.00 Draw, course SW.,

13.60 Spur, slopes S.,

15.70 Draw, course SW.,

18.30 Spur, slopes SE., desc. 18 ft. over E. slope.

19.30 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 7 and 18, with brass cap marked

$$\frac{1}{4} \frac{S 7}{S 18}$$

A chinquapin, 9 ins. diam., bears S.14°W., 53 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 18 B T

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.28°W., 53 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 7 B T

Desc. 440 ft. over broken SE. slope.

37.50 Steamboat Trail, and telephone line, bears NE. and SW.

39.40 Steamboat Creek, 98 lks. wide, course SW., asc. 179 ft.
