59.30 Cor. of secs. 7, 8, 17, and 18.

Land; mountainous.

Soil; rocky mountain loam, 4th rate.

Timber; fir, hemlock, cedar, yew, pine, and chinquapin.

Undergrowth; rhododendron, chinquapin, vinemaple,

huckleberry, and mountain laurel.

N.0°04'W., bet. secs. 7 and 8

Along W. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

2.30 Spur, slopes NW., desc. 100 ft. over NW. slope.

10.40 Way trail, bears NW. and SE.

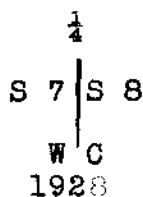
11.30 Spur, slopes NW., desc. 75 ft. over NE. slope.

17.00 Reynolds Creek, 30 lks. wide, course NW., asc. 20 ft. over SW. slope.

18.20 Spur, slopes NW., along gradual W. slope.

27.40 Reynolds Ridge Trail bears NW. and SE.

37.20 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for witness cor. to $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 7 and 8, with brass cap marked

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears N.60°W., 5 lks.

dist., marked W C $\frac{1}{4}$ S 7 B T

38.00 Left bank of Steamboat Creek.

40.00 Point for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. falls in creek, impracticable to set cor.

45.00 Center of Creek, 50 lks. wide, course S.10°W.,

48.90 Right bank of creek, asc. 377 ft. over SE. slope.
