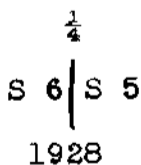


Subdivisions of T. 25 S., R. 2 E.

Timber; fir, hemlock, cedar, yew, and pine.
Undergrowth; mountain laurel, rhododendron, vinemaple,
and hazel.

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
98.70 Intersect N. bdy. of Tp. 14 lks. E. of cor. of secs.

Thence
S.0*18'E., on true line bet. secs. 5 and 6
Asc. 360 ft. over broken NE. slope, through heavy
timber and dense undergrowth.
4.30 Draw, course NE.,
5.20 Spur, slopes NE.,
11.70 Draw, course NE.,
17.10 Ridge, bears N.60*W. and S.60*E., trail along top of
ridge, desc. 720 ft. over broken SW. slope to $\frac{1}{4}$ sec.
cor.
33.60 Draw, course W.,
39.10 Spur, slopes SW.,
46.90 Draw, course SW.,
48.70 Spur, slopes W.,
58.70 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in
the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 6, with
brass cap marked

A cedar, 8 ins. diam., bears S.45*W., 24 lks.
dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 6 B T

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.27*E., 29 lks.
dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 5 B T
