

Dependent Resurvey of S. Bdy. of T. 24 S., R. 3 E.

CHAINS

27.80 West edge of lake, bears S. 2.30 chs., enter heavy timber and medium undergrowth, bears NE. and SW.

39.96 The  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 33 only, which is an iron post, 1 in. diam., 8 ins. above ground, firmly set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record.

Thence

N.89°44'W., on true line bet. secs. 4 and 33

Over nearly level land.

1.92 Mid point bet. closing cors., as hereinafter determined; set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 4 only, with brass cap mkd.

23.70 Creek, 4 lks. wide, course NW.,

36.10 Spur, slopes N., desc. 237 ft. over W. slope.

40.10 The cor. of secs. 32 and 33 only, which is an iron post, 2 ins. diam., 8 ins. above ground, firmly set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record.

Land; mountainous.

Soil; mountain loam, 3rd. rate.

Timber; fir, hemlock, cedar, and pine.

Undergrowth; vine maple, rhododendron, hazel, alder, and yew.
