Subdivisions of T. 25 S., R. 3 E.

CHAINS

- 78.50 Peak, Calapooya Mountains, divide bet. the North Umpqua and the Willamette rivers, bears NW. and SE., desc. 6 ft. over SW. slope.
- 79.82 The cor. of secs. 14, 15, 22, and 23  
Land; mountainous.  
Soil; rocky, 4th rate.  
Timber; fir, hemlock, pine, cedar, and yew.  
Undergrowth; huckleberry, alder, willow, elderberry, and manzanita.

- N.0°02'W., bet. secs. 14 and 15  
Asc. 17 ft. over SW. slope, through scattered timber and light undergrowth.
- 1.50 Peak, Calapooya Mountains, divide bet. the North Umpqua and the Willamette rivers, bears N.75°W., and SE., desc. 555 ft. over N., changing to NE. slope.  
The E. edge of Loleta Lakes, bears N.19°W., about 20.00 chs. dist.  
Enter heavy timber and medium undergrowth, bears SE. and N.75°W.
- 19.60 Desc. 82 ft. along gradual E. slope.
- 36.70 Top of bluff, 55 ft. high, bears N.80°W. and S.80°E., desc. 180 ft. over NE. slope, over bluff.
- 40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. with brass cap mkd.
