

Township 25 South, Range 3 East

CHAINS

Bristow Trail, the Mountain Meadows Trail, and the Calapooya Trail come together in the east center of sec. 22; The Bristow Trail follows the Calapooya Ridge to the NW., The Calapooya Trail follows it to the SE., and the Mountain Meadows Trail bears in a southerly direction around the west side of Balm Mountain; Skipper Lakes Trail leaves the Mountain Meadows Trail in the SW. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. 35 and bears NE. around the east side of Balm Mountain joining the Calapooya Trail in sec. 23, near the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 23 and 24; Staley Ridge Trail leaves the Calapooya Trail in the SE. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. 24 and bears northerly along the top of Staley Ridge. There are numerous way trails and stock drive ways to other parts of the township. A Forest Service telephone line enters the township along the Mountain Meadows Trail in sec. 35 and bears northerly over the top of Balm Mountain to near the center of sec. 23, thence northwesterly to the west center of sec. 9, thence northeasterly along the Bristow Trail leaving the township in sec. 4 near the closing cor. of secs. 3 and 4. Another Forest Service telephone line follows the Grassy Ranch Trail to its junction with the Bristow Trail Thence along the Bristow Trail to sec. 9 where the two lines join.

With the exception of the SW. part this township is covered with many meadows of native grasses which afford Summer range for several hundred sheep. Surrounding these meadows the township is covered with a heavy growth of fir, hemlock, cedar, pine, and some yew and madrona; all of small commercial value. There is a medium to dense undergrowth of mountain laurel, vinemaple, rhododendron, cascara,
