wild cherry, huckleberry, hazel, alder, and elderberry, over the township.

No indications of any minerals were noticed on this township.

The Forest Service has a lookout station in sec. 23 near the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 23 and 26. This is the only building of any nature in the township. Oakridge, about 35 miles from sec. 4, by trail and road, to the NW., is the nearest supply point and Postoffice.

The average of a considerable number of readings over all parts of the township gives a value of $21^{\circ}15'E.$, for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of $5^{\circ}30'$ in local attraction.
