Soil; volcanic ashes 4th rate.

Timber; Fir, Hemlock and Pine.

Undergrowth; Hemlock and Pine.

Mountainous land heavily timbered or covered with dense undergrowth 80.00 chains Sept. 5th., 1902.

East Boundary of Tp. 25 S.,
R. 5 E. as Surveyed by
Henry C. Perkins, Deputy
Surveyor, under Contract No.
751, dated, July 25, 1902.

I commence at the corner of Tps. 24 and 25 S R 5 E Latitude 43°25' N Longitude 122°09'W., which I previous established,

Thence I run South on Range line on E bdy. of sec. 1, over mountainous land, heavily timbered and with dense undergrowth Descending from cor.

10.00 Foot of ridge bears E and W Ascend another ridge.

12.00 Summit of ridge bears E and W Descend steeply.

39.00 Foot of steep descent, descend gently

40.00 Set a Hemlock post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 2 ft. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 1 on W and 5 on E face, from which;

A Hemlock, 24 ins. diam., bears N.20°E., 26 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 5 B T.

A Hemlock, 6 ins. diam., bears S.60°W., 19 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 1 B T.

51.00 Foot of ridge, ascend another ridge bears NW and SE

58.00 Summit of Ridge, bears NW and SE

72.00 Foot of Ridge, ascend steeply.

80.00 A Larch, 12 ins. diam., for cor. of secs. 1 and 12 marked
