East Boundary of T. 25 S., Range 5 E.,
As surveyed by Henry Clay Perkins, Deputy Surveyor,
Under contract No. 751, dated July 25, 1902.

CHAINS

I commence at the corner of Tps. 24 and 25 S., R. 5 E.
Thence I run S. on Range line on E. bdy. of sec. 1,
over mountainous land, heavily timbered and with dense
undergrowth. Descending from cor.

10.00 Foot of ridge bears E. and W. Ascend another ridge.
12.00 Summit of ridge bears E. and W. Descend steeply.
39.00 Foot of steep descent, descend gently.
40.00 Set a hemlock post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 2 ft. in
ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 1 on W, and 5 on
E. face, from which,
A hemlock, 24 ins. in dia., bears N.20*E. 26 lks.
dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 5 B T.
A hemlock, 6 ins. in dia., bears S.60*W. 19 lks.
dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 1 B T.

51.00 Foot of ridge,-ascend another ridge bears NW. and SE.
58.00 Summit of ridge, bears NW. and SE.
72.00 Foot of ridge, ascend steeply.
80.00 A larch, 12 in dia., for cor. of Secs. 1 and 12 marked
T 25 S S 12 on SW. and R 5 E S 1 on NW., with 1 notch
on N. and 5 on S. edges, from which,
A fir, 6 ins. in dia., bears S.44*W. 14 lks. dist.,
marked T 25 S R 5 E S 12 B T.
A fir, 12 ins. in dia., bears N.75*W. 9 lks. dist.,
marked T 25 S R 5 E S 1 B T.
