

Survey of East Boundary of Tp. 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ S., R. 2 E.

CHAINS

From the cor. of Tps. 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ and 26 S., Rs. 2 and 3 E., which is an iron post, 3 ins. diam., 8 ins. above ground, marked and witnessed as described in the field notes of T. 26 S., R. 2 E.

North bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Asc. 267 ft. over SW., changing to S. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

11.20 Peak on ridge, bears NW. and SE., desc. 700 ft. over N., changing to NE. slope.

35.90 Intersect S. bdy. of T. 25 S., R. 2 E., 17 lks. E of the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 36 only, hereinbefore described; at point of intersection set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. of T. 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ S., Rs. 2 and 3 E., with brass cap marked

A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.72*W., 30 lks. dist., marked T 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ S R 2 E S 36 C C B T.

Land; mountainous.

Soil; rocky, 4th rate.

Timber; Fir, Pine, Cedar, Yew, and Madrona.

Undergrowth; Rhododendron, Vinemaple, Huckleberry, Chinquapin, Buck Brush, Gooseberry, and Manzanita.
