CHAINS

From the cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32, and 33, on S. bdy. of Tp. as described in the field notes of T. 26 S., R. 2 E.

N.0°03'W., bet. secs. 32 and 33

Desc. 10 ft. along NW. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

- 2.30 Small stream, course W., asc. 260 ft. over SW. slope
- 12.70 Spur, slopes W., desc. 130 ft. over NW. slope
- 26.00 Draw, course W., asc. 64 ft. over SW. slope
- 31.90 Spur, slopes NW., desc. 20 ft. over NE. slope
- 34.90 Intersect the S. bdy. of T. 25 S., R. 2 E., 5 lks. E. of the ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 32 only, hereinbefore described; at point of intersection set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. of secs. 32 and 33, with brass cap marked

A Fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S.40°W., 37 lks. dist. marked T 25½ S R 2 E S 32 C C B T

Soil; rocky, 4th rate.

Timber; Fir, Pine, Cedar, Hemlock, Yew, Oregon Maple, Alder, Madrona, and Dogwood.

Undergrowth; Vinemaple, Rhododendron, Wild Cherry, Chinquapin, Manzanita, Hazel, Buck Brush, Arrow-wood, and Huckle berry.
