	North, bet. secs. 31 and 36.
	Desc. 12 ft. over NE. slope, through heavy timber and medium undergrowth.
1.60	Draw, drains NE., asc. 30 ft. over SE. slope.
4.00	Desc. 60 ft. over NE Slope.
7.30	Spur, slopes N., from SW., desc. 40 ft. over N. slope, along top of spur.
12.80	Spur, slopes NW., desc. 587 ft. over N. slope.
32.60	Creek, 5 lks. wide, course E., asc. 79 ft. over SE. slope.
35.86	Intersect the south bdy. of sec. 36, T. 25 S. R. 3 E., 5.42 chs. E. of the 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 36, only. At point of intersection set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. of Tps. 25½ S., Rs. 3 and 4 E., with brass cap mkd.
