Thence from the cor. of secs. 2,3, 34 and 35, on S. bdy. of Tp., which is an iron post, 2 ins. diam., 9 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described in the official record.

N.0°02'W., bet. secs. 34 and 35.

Over nearly level land, through heavy timber and medium undergrowth

6.20 Asc. 92 ft. over S. slope.

6.90 Way trail, bears E. and W.,

10.00 Spur, slopes W., desc. 264 ft. over N., changing to NW. slope.

17.70 Point of bluff, 50 ft. high, bears NE. and S.10°E.,

21.80 Asc. 40 ft. along broken W. slope.

31.60 Spur, slopes NW., desc. 140 ft. over N. slope.

35.80 Intersect S. bdy. of sec. 34, T. 25 S., R. 3 E., 5.28

chs. E. of the 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 34 only.

At point of intersection set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 20 ins. in the ground to bedrock, and in a mound of stone 3 ft. base to top, for closing cor. of secs. 34 and 35, with brass cap mkd.
