

Subdivision of T. 25½ S., R. 3 E.

CHAINS

Thence from cor of secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34, on S. bdy. of Tp., which is an iron post, .2 ins. diam., 10 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described in the official record.

N.0\*02'W., bet. secs. 33 and 34.

Desc. 111 ft. over N. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

3.70 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course W., asc. 371 Ft. over S. slope.

16.10 Way trail, bears E. and W., along top of spur, slopes desc. 586 ft. over NW. slope.

35.81 Intersect S. bdy. of sec. 33, T. 25 S., R. 3 E., 5.12 chs. E. of the 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 33 only

At point of intersection set an iron post, 3 ft. long 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. of secs. 33 and 34, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears S.45\*E., 43 lks. dist., mkd. T 25½ S R 3 E S 34 C C B T

A fir, 26 ins. diam., bears S.48\*W., 67 lks. dist., mkd. T 25½ S R 3 E S 33 C C B T

Land: Mountainous

Soil; rocky, 4th rate.

Timber; fir, hemlock, pine, yew, madrona, and cedar.

Undergrowth; rhododendron, vinemaple, hazel, service berry, manzanita, and chinquapin.

Thence from the cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32, and 33, on the S. bdy. of Tp., which is an iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set in mound of stone, 3½ ft. base,
