which is an iron post, 2 ins. diam., 8 ins. above the ground, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described in the official record.

4.70 Spur, slopes E., desc. 398 ft. over N., changing to NE. slope, through heavy timber and medium undergrowth

15.70 Creek, 6 lks. wide, course SE., asc. 476 ft. over S. slope.

29.20 Spur, slopes SE., desc. 54 ft. along NE. slope.

34.40 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course SE., asc. 15 ft. over SW. slope.

35.78 Intersect S. bdy. of sec. 31 T 25 S R 3 E., 4.96 chs. E. of the 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 31 only

At point of intersection set an iron post, 3 ft. long 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for the closing cor. of secs. 31 and 32, with brass cap mkd.
