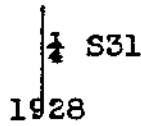


Dependent Resurvey of the Willamette Meridian
through T. 26 S.

CHAINS

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 27 ins. in ground, for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 31 only, with brass cap marked,



from which

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.64*E., 36 lks. dist.

Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 31 B T.

A yew, 8 ins. diam., bears S.13*E., 15 lks. dist.

Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 31 B T.

22.60 Draw, course NE.

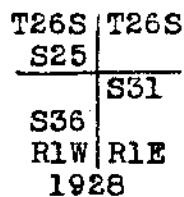
31.30 Dry creek bed, 4 lks. wide, course NW.

39.98 Intersect the old cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, which is a conglomerate stone, 10x5x5 ins. above ground, marked with 5 notches on the N. and 1 notch on the S. edge.

I change this cor. to refer to secs. 25 and 36 only, obliterating the scribe marks on the NE. and SE. bearing trees.

Alongside of old stone cor,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in diam., 27 ins. in ground, for the cor. of secs. 25 and 36 only, with brass cap marked,



from which

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.72 $\frac{3}{4}$ *E., 102 lks. dist.

Marked T 26 S R 1 E S 30 B T (old B. T.)

A fir, 16 ins. in diam., bears S.28*E., 40 lks.

Marked T 26 S R 1 E S 31 B T (old B. T.)

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.35*W., 33 lks. dist.

Marked T 26 S R 1 W S 36 B T (old B. T.)
