80.10 Intersect the E. bdy. of the Tp., 7 lks. S. of the cor.
of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30, hereinbefore described.

Thence,

N.89*58'W., on a true line bet. secs. 24 and 25.

Ascend 180 ft. over E. slope., through timber and brush.

8.00 Spur, slopes NE.

Descend 665 ft. over broken NW. slope.

36.70 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N.30*E.

Ascend 160 ft. over NE. slope.

40.05 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 27 ins. in
the ground, for the $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked,

47.10 Small draw, course NE.

55.90 Head of small ravine, course N.75*E.

67.70 Divide, bet. Calf Creek and Limpy Creek, and Calf Creek
Way Trail, bear N.15*E. and S.15*W.

Descend 330 ft. over W. slope.

73.28 Glen Echo branch of the Calf Creek Way Trail, bears N.30*
W., and S.30*E.

80.10 The cor. of secs. 23, 24, 25 and 26.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky loam, third rate.

Timber, fir, madrone, pine and cedar.

Undergrowth, vine maple and chinquapin.
