CHAINS

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.67*E., 52 lks. dist.

Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 3 B T.

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S.26*W., 43 lks. dist.

Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 4 B T.

Ascend 208 ft. over NW. slope.

52.50 Spur, slopes W.

Descend 660 ft. over SW. slope.

72.50 Old North Umpqua River Trail, bears E. and W.

80.23 The cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky loam, third rate.

Timber, fir and madrone.

Undergrowth, vine maple and second growth timber.

From the cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32 and 33 on the S. bdy. of the Tp., as described in the notes of T. 27 S., R. 1 E.

Thence,

N.0*03*W., bet. secs. 32 and 33.

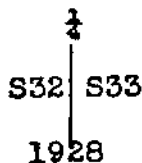
Ascend 284 ft. over broken S. slope, through timber and brush.

20.90 Ridge, bears E. and W.

Descend 110 ft. over N. slope.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked,

Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 33 B T.

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S.85*W., 110 lks. dist.

Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 32 B T.
