

Subdivisions, T. 26 S., R. 1 E.

CHAINS

S.89*53*W., on a true line bet. secs. 29 and 32.

Descend 290 ft. over broken NW. slope, through timber and brush.

4.10 Top of bluff, 20 ft. high, bears N. and S., faces W.

11.70 Creek, 4 lks. wide, course NE.

Ascend 520 ft. over broken E. slope.

34.26 North and South Trail and telephone line, bears N.20*E., and S.20*W.

40.11 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 16 ins. in the ground to bedrock, supported in a mound of stone, with a 3 ft. base, 1 ft. high, for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked,

from which

A cedar, 24 ins. diam., bears N.19*E., 20 lks. dist.

Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 29 B T.

A cedar, 18 ins. diam., bears S.13*W., 41 lks. dist.

Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 32 B T.

Ascend 264 ft. over E. slope.

59.70 Ridge, bears N. and S.

Descend 320 ft. over broken W. slope.

62.60 Head of draw, course NW.

76.20 Panther Creek, 3 lks. wide, course NW.

77.40 Dry creek bed, 1 lk. wide, course NE.

Ascend 100 ft. over NE. slope.

80.22 The cor. of secs. 29, 30, 31 and 32.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky loam, third rate.

Timber, fir, cedar and hemlock.

Undergrowth, vine maple, rhododendron and second growth timber.
