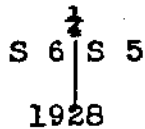

General Description

This township lies within the Umpqua National Forest and is very rough and mountainous, ranging in elevation from 1000 ft. on the North Umpqua River to 5,000 ft. above sea level on the highest points. Lookout Mt. located in the SE. $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 31, and Dog Mt., located in the S. central portion of sec. 1 are the highest points in this Tp.
