Asc. 145 ft. over SE. slope.

48.70 Spur, slopes E., desc. 120 ft. over NE. slope.

56.70 Along broken E., slope.

70.50 Desc. 171 ft. over broken N. slope.

76.90 Draw, course NE.,

79.60 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course NE., asc. 23 ft. over S. slope.

80.00 Point for cor. of secs. 1, 2, 11, and 12, falls on
 steep insecure ground, impracticable to set cor.,
 At point, 33 lks. N.0*16'W., set witness cor.

Land; mountainous.

Soil; rocky, mountain loam, 4th rate.

Timber; fir, pine, cedar, yew, hemlock, madrona, and
 dogwood.

Undergrowth; winemaple, huckle berry, buckbrush, and
 hazel.

N.89*51'E., on a random line bet. secs. 1 and 12.

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

80.12 Intersect E. bdy. of Tp. at cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7, and 12,
 hereinbefore described.

Thence

S.89*51'W., on true line bet. secs. 1 and 12

Asc. 512 ft. over E. slope, along top of spur, through
 heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

21.90 Spur, ridge, bears NW. and SE., desc. 911 ft. over broken
 SW. slope.

40.06 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in
 the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 12, with
 brass cap mkd.
