56.50 Eagle Creek, 1 lk. wide, course S., asc. 24 ft. along broken S. slope, through heavy timber and medium undergrowth.

74.20 Creek bed, dry, course, S.85*E., asc. 62 ft. over NE. slope.

80.30 Cor. of secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15.

Land; mountainous.

Soil; rocky, 4th rate.

Timber; fir, pine, cedar, hemlock, and Oregon maple.

Undergrowth; vinemaple, mountain laurel, willow, hazel, dogwood, and arrow-wood.

N.0*02'W., bet. secs. 10 and 11

Desc. 12 ft. over NE. slope, through medium timber and medium undergrowth.

0.70 Draw, course S.60*E., asc. 527 ft. over SE. slope.

17.20 Spur, slopes E., desc. 91 ft. along NE. slope.

29.90 Draw, course SE., asc. 64 ft. over SE. slope.

32.40 Spur, slopes E., desc. 120 ft. over NE. slope.

36.10 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course E., along broken E. slope.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 10 and 11, with brass cap mkd.
