80.30 Cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11.

Land; mountainous.

Soil; rocky, 4th rate.

Timber; fir, hemlock, cedar, pine, yew, Oregon maple, madrona, and chinquapin.

Undergrowth; vinemaple, wild cherry, mountain laurel, rhododendron, hazel, buck brush, huckle berry, manzanita, goose berry, and arrow-wood.

From the cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34, on S. bdy. of this Tp. as described in the field notes of T. 27 S., R. 2 E., of this Group.

N.0*02'W., bet. secs. 33 and 34.

Desc. 1014 ft. over broken NE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

30.60 Spur, slopes NE.,

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 33 and 34, with brass cap mkd.

A pine, 24 ins. diam., bears S.68*W., 69 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S 33 B T
